AN ARTIST ON A GRAPHIC JOURNEY BACK TO THE PAST

I was born during the baby boom and much of my childhood became the pop culture of America. Family vacations were taken on Route 66 in our classic '55 Chevy where we stopped at roadside diners that are now part of the past. I grew up watching "I Love Lucy", "The Mickey Mouse Club" and necking in cars at drive-in movies. I listened to the legends of Rock and Roll like the Beatles, the Stones and the Beach Boys. I was part of the Peanut Gallery and hurried home to watch American Bandstand.

My teens were the time of Woman's Lib, the Peace Movement, Viet Nam, Nixon and Khrushchev's shoe, the Cold War, the Moon Landing, Pop Psychology, Mini Skirts and Motown. I bought 45's, ironed my hair, wore bell bottoms, drank cherry cokes at an actual soda fountain, and cruised the Tastee Freeze trolling for boys.

American Graffiti was my childhood, Peter Pan was my dream, Platoon was my reality and Haight-Ashbury was my destination. Now decades later I find myself going home again in the only way I know how, through my art.

BIOGRAPHY

My interest in art began early in life. Growing up in Kansas I was never without a crayon in my hand. From grade school through college my main emphasis was on being an artist.

I worked in the commercial market for nearly fifteen years as an illustrator and designer for publishers, advertising agencies and corporate marketing agencies. Nowadays I stay involved in the graphics industry producing marketing packages and web graphics for a select number of small businesses.

In 1981 I started participating in fine art shows and just recently retired from exhibiting my fine art at shows to concentrate on the PopArtDiva enterprises. In the mid 1990's I installed my first graphics software and discovered a whole new excitement in creating art digitally. Currently I apply my computer graphics skills to creating print media, web sites, and Fine Art Digital Images for PopArtDiva.Com.
